| Language Requirements | The New School does not require TOEFL, IELTS, or PTE scores for applicants who meet at least one of the following: Whose native language is English Who attend a University or a secondary school where English is the primary language of instruction (minimum of three years' attendance) Who have successfully completed two full semesters of non-ESL college-level expository writing Who have earned a four-year degree from a U.S. college/university or from a university where English is the primary language of instruction (minimum of three years' attendance) |
| | Students who do not meet the above requirements must submit one of the following: TOEFL Internet-based test score of 92 |
